## **Study Questions from 19.03.2023 sermon**

### **Read**

- i. Pray for the Spirit's leading, then read Acts 2:41—42 & Luke 22:13—20.

### **Discuss**

- ii. Do you call it The Breaking of Bread, The Lord's Supper, Communion, The Lord's Table, or something else? Which is correct? Why?
- iii. Discuss the historical roots of the Lord's Supper - what are the links between the past and present meals?
- iv. The Lord's Supper is:
  - A symbol of the new covenant
  - To remember and give thanks for Jesus' death
  - A time where we have communion (fellowship) with God and each other
  - Spiritual nourishment where our souls are fed and built up
  - An anticipation of the future Marriage Supper of the Lamb

Share with your group: which of these did you not understand/is new to you/do you enjoy most/did you learn most about?

- v. Read 1 Corinthians 11:27-29. When we examine ourselves before the Lord's Supper, what sorts of questions should we be asking ourselves?
- vi. How are we doing at taking The Lord's Supper in Argyle? Are there any ways we can improve/enhance our time at The Lord's Table?

### **Prayer time**

- vii. Pray for the Lord's Supper each week to be a time of spiritual nourishment for our souls and of fellowship with God and each other, and pray against 'familiarity breeding contempt'.
