

Acts 3 | Share the Good News Study Questions from 30.04.2023 sermon

Discuss

Read Acts 3:11-19. Things were going well for the early Christians in Acts 2. It might have been tempting for them to try and keep things the way they were, to preserve their bubble of fellowship and happiness. But they didn't. They moved out into the world with the good news.

It can be tempting for us to neglect sharing the gospel and stay in our 'holy-huddles'. But we need to get out there and tell people about Jesus. We do this by being intentional, contextual, personal and gentle.

- Look at Acts 3:11—19. From these verses, how is Peter intentional in sharing the gospel?
 Discuss how we can be intentional.
- ii. Peter is **contextual** when he shares the gospel in Acts 3. What does this mean and how can we do it?
- iii. Look at Acts 3:13—15 and 19. How is Peter **personal** in sharing the gospel in these verses?
- iv. Part of being personal in sharing the gospel is pointing out that people have sinned.This can be difficult. Discuss the best way(s) to tell people they are sinners in need of a saviour.
- v. Which verse(s) of Acts 3 show us that Peter is **gentle** in sharing the gospel? What things might stop us or cause us to forget to be gentle?
- vi. In Acts 3:1-10 we see the lame man healed. How is this a real-life parable for us and what does it teach us about how to share the gospel?

vii. Pray for opportunities to share the gospel - and pray we would do it like Peter did in Acts 3.
