Study Questions from 11.05.2025 sermon

Introduction

- i. Share with your group a time when you gathered in unity with Christians from many different denominations and countries. What was it like? What emotions did you experience?

Discuss

- ii. Read Eph. 2:19. Discuss the advantages and blessings of being “fellow citizens”. Why do you think Paul chose this metaphor?
- iii. Read Eph. 2:19 again. Discuss why Paul switches metaphors from “fellow citizens” to “household”?
- iv. What is the overall main point Paul is making in 2:19 and what implications does it have for us at Argyle?
- v. Read Eph. 2:21-22. List the 6 temples in the Bible and discuss the function and importance of God’s temple in scripture. (If you get stuck here are the refs for the 6 temples: Gen 1-3; Ex. 25; 1 Kings 6; John 1:14, 2:21; Eph. 2:21-22; Rev. 21:1-5)
- vi. Look at v21-22 and discuss the significance of the words “whole building” and “you too”. How do these words relate/apply to Argyle Community Church?
- vii. In v21-22 Paul says the purpose of each Christian and of the church, is to be a temple. Discuss the outworking of this in day to day life, particularly with regards to the Holy Spirit.
