

Jeremiah 36 | Study Questions* from 09.11.2025 sermon

The scroll

Read Jeremiah 36 v 1-4

The year is 605 BC. The people of Jerusalem are relatively independent, but the Babylonian Empire is gobbling up small nations all around the area. The Lord tells Jeremiah to write out all of his sermons and prophecies onto a scroll (v 2).

- i. Why (v 3)?
- ii. If Judah listen to what has been written, what will God do?

The king's response

After reading the contents of the scroll in the temple, Baruch - Jeremiah's scribe - is ushered into the presence of the king to read the Lord's warning.

Read verses 20-25

- iii. What did the king do (v 23)?
- iv. What is the significance of this action?
- v. Why do you think he did it?

Another king's response

Read Psalm 19 v 7-14

- vi. How does David's attitude to God's word compare to his descendant Jehoiakim's?
- vii. How do you see these two attitudes in the world you live in?
- viii. Do you ever see them struggling against each other in your heart? If so, how do you overcome?
