Discuss

- i. What exactly is worship? Come up with a definition.
- ii. How do you feel about the emphasis on worship in Argyle right now (through changes to our Sunday services and this sermon series)? What would you like to learn about worship? What excites you or worries you?
- iii. Worship happens in everyday life in the week as well as in church on Sundays. Read Romans 12:1. Discuss the significance of Paul's use of the word 'sacrifice' and how it relates to worship in everyday life.
- iv. Look at Romans 12:1 again. Discuss the significance of Paul's use of the word 'bodies' and how it relates to worship in everyday life.
- v. Read Romans 12:2. The word 'transformed' comes from the Greek word 'metamorphose'. The same word occurs in Matt. 12:2 translated 'transfigured' and 2 Cor. 3:18 'transformed'. What does this word teach us about everyday life worship?
- vi. In Romans 12:2 Paul says 'be transformed.' Who transforms us? How?
