1. This is reliable, vital Good News – 1:1-4

a. Reliable – Luke is a careful historian -
1:3,5; 2:1,2; 3:1

b. Vital v.4 The Good News about
Jesus provides a solid foundation for
life.

1. Preaching the Bad News

- warning of judgement –v.7,9,16,17
- urging repentance –v.8,11,13,14

2. Preaching Good News – v.3,18

The cost of faithfulness –v.19,20

The Good News - Jesus

1. Who he is

- The Son of God – v.22,38
- The son of Adam – v.38

2. The Saviour – the perfect one “becoming” a sinner – points to the Cross where:-

- Jesus took our sin- 2Cor.5:21; 1Pet.2:24; Is.53:6
- Jesus bore our judgement – Is.53:5; Gal.3:13; Rom.3:25,26; Mk.15:33,34
